> > And every colour You've ever seen: Silver and violet, Orange and green.


> > > He holds them Like a big bouquet As they tug and bounce And bump and sway.

as high as her neck...


Suddenly a great wave came rolling in and lifted her right off her feet, and when she came down there was no sandy bottom under her feet, no bottom at all.
