Activity 4	Imagine you live in a cave, write a paragraph describing what it is like.
Activity 5	Find pictures of animals, tools, shelters or anything else related to the stone age and present them on a poster with a short sentence explaining each thing.
Activity 6	Research the woolly mammoth and present facts on a poster. Make it as big and bright as you want on paper or even on the back of a cardboard box!
